1. Florence Nightingale was a nurse in the Crimean War.
2. Before Florence arrived in Scutari, the hospitals were in terrible condition.
3. Many of the wounded soldiers were unwashed and sleeping in overcrowded, dirty rooms.
4. Florence and her team changed these conditions for the better.
5. Florence was known as the 'Lady of the Lamp'.

Edith Cavell



1. In 1907, Edith set up a nursing school in Brussels where she trained nurses.
2. Edith nursed soldiers during WW1. She helped soldiers from all countries.
3. Edith was arrested and sentenced to death for treason. She was killed by a German firing squad.
4. Edith is recognised as a pioneer for modern nursing.

William Caxton



1. William Caxton bought the printing press to England.
2. Before the printing press, all books had to be hand written with a quill and ink which took a long time.
3. The printing press meant that books could be printed quickly and cheaply.
4. William Caxton had many jobs including a merchant, a diplomat and a translator.

Tim Berners Lee



1. In 1989, Sir Tim Berners Lee invented the World Wide Web.
2. The internet makes it easy to allow people to share documents and information.
3. In 2003, he was awarded a knighthood by the Queen.
4. During the Olympics opening ceremony in 2012, he tweeted saying 'This is for everyone'.
