1	Europe	The continent in which we find the UK.
2	Parliament	Parliament represents the people, makes laws and oversees the government.
3	County	An area of the UK that decides how to run things locally.
4	City	A large town or any large town which has a cathedral.
5	Town	A built up area which is bigger than a village and smaller than a city.
6	Village	A group of houses and buildings. Larger than a Hamlet and smaller than a town.
7	Hamlet	A small settlement, smaller than a village.
8	Rural	Relates to the countryside and not the town.
9	Urban	Characteristic of a town or city.
10	Topography	The arrangement of natural and physical features of land.
11	Population	All of the people of a particular place.

How has Birmingham changed over time?

1	1340	Birmingham was known for its wool and metal working industry.
2	1535	Birmingham was a market town with a population of 1,500.
3	1750	St Phillips Church had been built and the population had risen to 73,000.
4	1900	Birmingham became much more urban and a lot less rural. Bike and tyre making became key industries.
5	2014	The population is now over 1 million people.
